Your Dubai Metro Map for 2021: Plan Your Route with Ease

The Dubai Metro Map 2021 can be found here: If you're taking the Dubai Metro to the 2020 Expo in Dubai, you'll need to know how to plan your route with ease. By using the <u>Dubai Metro Map 2021 PDF</u>, you can easily choose between two metro lines, find out which stations are connected by pedestrian bridges and learn how many minutes you'll need to take from point A to point B at any time of day. Here are some other features of the map that will help you use it effectively.

The Biggest Changes

The new line will be split into two sections. Line 1, which opened in 2009, will go from Nakheel Harbour and Tower Station to Ras Al Khor, where it will meet up with a new link to Business Bay. Meanwhile, a separate second line will run from Rashidiya Station to Ibn Battuta Mall via Dubai Marina. The intersections of both lines will connect at Union Square/Baniyas Square.

New Lines and Stations on The Red Line

Last December, The Roads and Transport Authority (RTA) added two more stations to The Red Line, bringing it to a total of 41 stations. So it's only natural that plans are underway to extend The Red Line to add a couple more new stations in the future.

New Lines, Trains, Stations and Termini on The Green Line

The Green Line will be extended from Nakheel Harbour and Tower Station to Palm Jumeirah and The World Islands, providing a new station at Palm Jumeirah. Two more stations – in front of The World Islands and near Dubailand – are also on their way. There will be a total of 20 stations along The Green Line by 2021.

New Lines, Trains, Stations and Termini on The Purple Line

Starting on March 2020, passengers will be able to use The Purple Line on a daily basis to travel between different areas of Dubai. This line will connect three stations – Al Qusais, International City and Mohammad Bin Rashid City – making it easier than ever to get from one end of town to another.
