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Steroid injections, also called corticosteroid injections, are anti-inflammatory medicines used to treat a range of conditions. They can be used to treat problems such as joint pain, arthritis, sciatica and inflammatory bowel disease.. Steroid injections are only given by healthcare professionals. Corticosteroids are not the same as anabolic steroids. Hydrocortisone injections are only available on prescription. They're usually given by a specially trained doctor in a GP's surgery or hospital clinic. In an emergency, medical staff may give higher dose hydrocortisone injections to treat severe asthma, allergic reactions, severe shock due.



Steroid injections can occasionally cause some thinning or changes in the colour of the skin at the injection site, especially if the injections are repeated. There is a possibility (at least in the opinion of some experts) that steroid injections may have a bad effect on soft tissue structures such as loss of cartilage tissue; however, the.

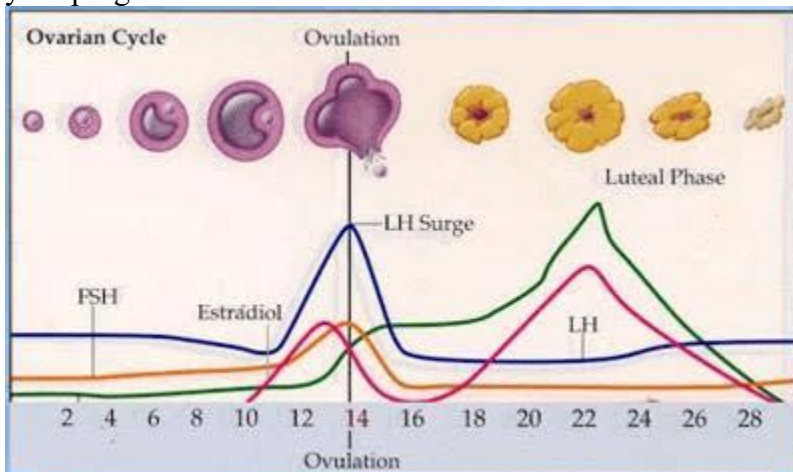


Steroid injections can be given to people of all ages, including children and teenagers with juvenile idiopathic arthritis (JIA). However, steroid injections should be used with care in young people. Only the lowest effective dose should be given, and for the shortest possible time. Too much steroid treatment for children could affect their growth.

Interlaminar epidural steroid injection involves injecting steroid medication into your back, in the area between your spine and spinal cord. The medication helps to decrease inflammation and irritation of nerve roots or herniated disks. Risks of complication for epidural steroid injection are low and include bleeding, infection, nerve injury or headache.



**Steroid Injections .** Steroid injections use a medicine called corticosteroid which reduces inflammation in your joint to relieve pain and allow you to move your joint to more easily. Steroid injections can also be called corticosteroid, cortisone, or hydrocortisone injections, or may be referred to as injection therapy. Injection therapy is the injection of steroid (corticosteroid) medications into painful joints or soft tissues to reduce pain and inflammation in that area. This may be recommended if you are unable to tolerate oral anti-inflammatories, if your condition is too painful for you to manage with physiotherapy exercises, or if your progress has.



Steroid injections in adult patients with joint and soft tissue conditions Risks of injections include 1. Pain 2. Worsening of symptoms eg carpal tunnel syndrome 3. Infection (<0.001%) 4. Fat atrophy or hypopigmentation 5. Post injection steroid flare for 24-48 hours (10%) 6. Tendon rupture ( 0.1%) 7. Transient blood sugar elevation in patients.

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
